NOMINATION FOR ELECTION TO BOARD OF DIRECTORS 2023

Rule 7.4.3 provides that one third of the Directors or, if their number is not a multiple of three, then the number nearest to one third, shall retire from office at the Annual General Meeting each year.

The Directors who shall retire at the 2023 Annual General Meeting will be Sarah Hewitt, Trisha Dunn and Greta Gordon; all of whom are eligible for re-election. In addition, there is a vacancy that has been filled by co-option.
