WAR AND CHANCE Having worked for some years as an editor/proofreader, I embarked on my very first KERIN FREEMAN The Daily T book - 'The Civilian Bomb Disposing Earl' - a biography of a very heroic man, an Earl, who became a spy and scientist for the British government in WWII. My second book, a novel set in a historical background, 'War and Chance', tells the story of a young British soldier sent to fight on foreign soil, witnessing first hand its atrocities. 'A Fit Day For Dark Disgrace' is also a true story set in the late 40s and early 50s in England, Australia and NZ, and tells the story of a young British man who came to New Zealand looking for a better way of life only to be hanged for which was an accident two years after he arrived.


## Anne Brady
