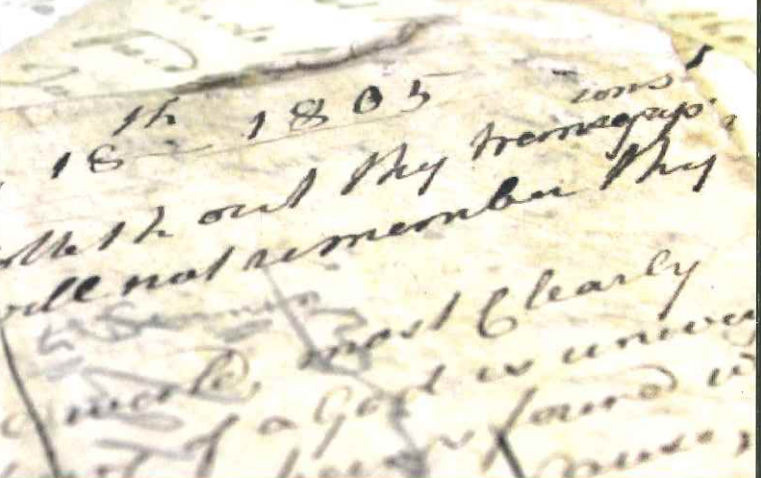




# **PRESBYTERIAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF IRELAND**

## What we have

- An extensive library of books on Presbyterianism in Ireland and elsewhere (for consultation only) that encompasses a rare book collection from the 17th century including early copies of Bibles and Psalters, histories of congregations, biographies, missionary works and family history resources.
- Objects such as communion plate, long handled collection plates, commemorative items, banners, and an excellent collection of communion tokens, some of which are on display in the reception area of Assembly Buildings.
- A collection of nearly 3,000 pamphlets, mainly from 19th century.
- Photographs and portraits of many ministers of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland as well as details of their careers.
- A collection of magazines from the three strands of Presbyterianism in Ireland, some dating back to the early 19th century.
- Information on different churches belonging to the Presbyterian Church in Ireland.
- Manuscripts and archives of ministers, organisations and missionaries.
- Various congregational records, both in original and copy form, as well as microfilm copies of all Presbyterian Church records filmed by PRONI.
